How to apply

To apply to one of our further education programmes, (SCQF levels one to six), apply online via the course page on the website. You'll find the apply button on the right-hand side of the page and it will take you to an online application form.

If you're applying to a part-time higher education programme (levels six to 12) or considering applying to UHI Inverness only to study a full-time HNC or HND, you can also apply via our courses page on our website. If you are considering applying for an HNC or HND place at UHI Inverness and another college/university, apply via UCAS.

If you are intending to study a full-time degree, apply via UCAS.

Fees and funding

You may be eligible for financial support towards the cost of studying. Most students do not have to pay course fees and many students receive support towards their living, travel, study and childcare expenses. The financial support you get depends on the level of course you study.

Further education students can apply for;

- + Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA)
- + Further Education Bursary, Travel and Study Allowance,
- + FE Childcare Fund
- + FE Discretionary Hardship Fund

Students studying higher education should apply for funding to the Student Awards Agency for Scotland www.saas.gov.uk for fees and student loans.

How we teach?

It is our priority to provide a flexible learning experience to allow you to achieve your full potential.

You'll be taught in an inclusive and dynamic environment that reflects current practice, delivered by staff who have up-to-date skills and industry experience.

You can choose to study full time and part time, either on campus, online or through blended learning which is a combination of both.

You will have access to Brightspace, our virtual learning environment, which provides online teaching and supplementary material for your course.

You'll develop the skills for learning, life and work in advanced industry-standard facilities.

Many of our courses offer the opportunity for work experience or field work to provide real-world experience.

Apprenticeships

We offer a range of Modern Apprenticeships and Graduate Apprenticeships. Apprentices make up nearly 20% of our student body.

This work-based training allows you to earn a wage while you learn.

As a Modern Apprentices you work for an employer and attend our campuses in blocks to gain skills and a Scottish Vocational Qualification that is linked to your job or industry. Our Modern Apprenticeship programmes cover a diverse range of sectors and have been developed in consultation with their industry.

Our Graduate Apprenticeship programme provides the opportunity to gain an industry recognised Higher Education qualification up to honours degree level whilst gaining valuable experience in the workplace.

We currently offer Graduate Apprenticeships in Civil Engineering, Early Learning and Childcare, Construction and the Built Environment, and Business Management.



Qualifications and progression explained

We use the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework to explain the level of a programme – SCQF level 1 being the equivalent of a National 1 in Scotland and SCQF level 12 a doctoral degree.

You can check the entry requirements for courses on our website to identify which level to apply for based on your prior learning and experience.

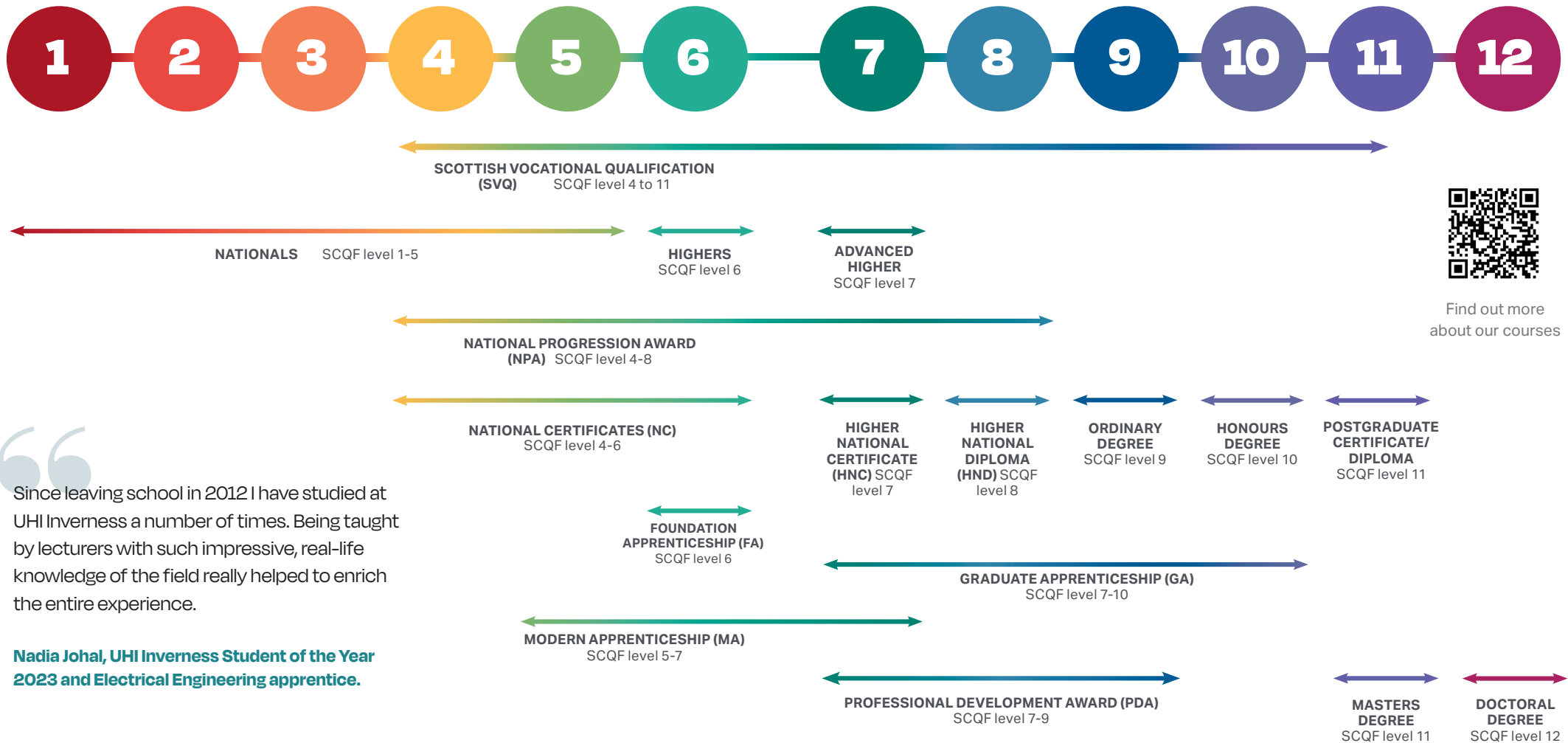
Progress with UHI Inverness

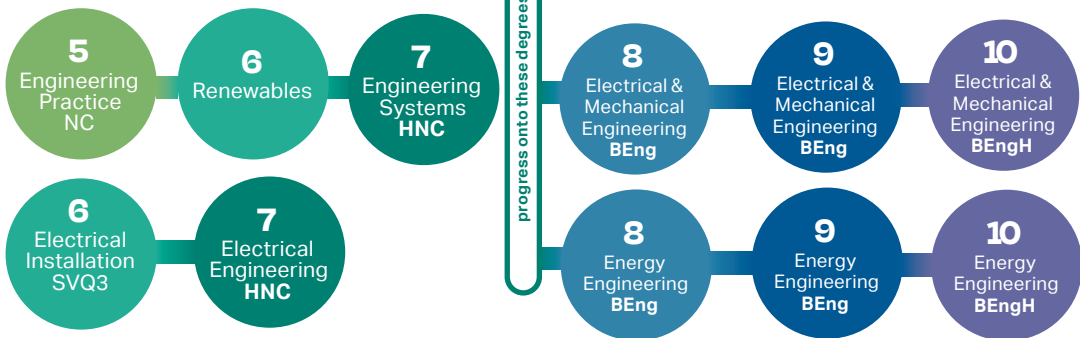

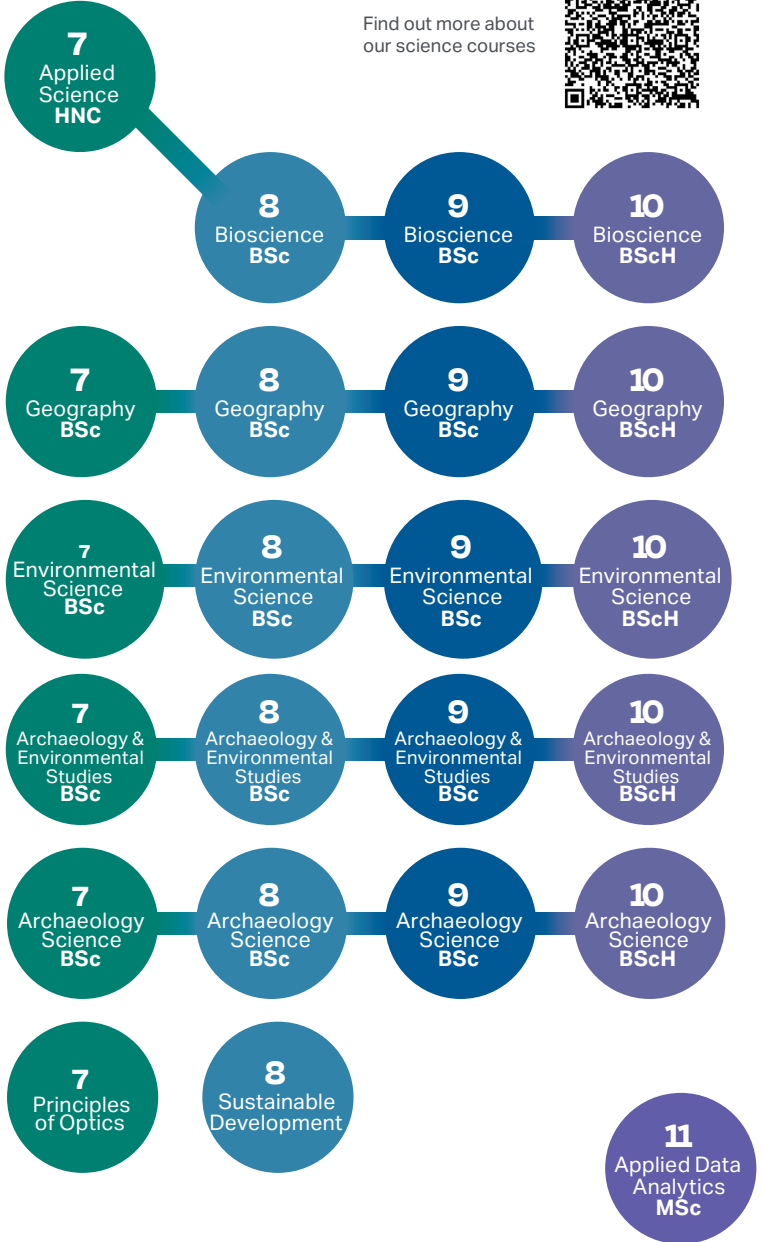
Science progression route

Our connections with clubs and sports organisations in and around Inverness, will allow you to gain the industry knowledge and skills to progress into the job market.

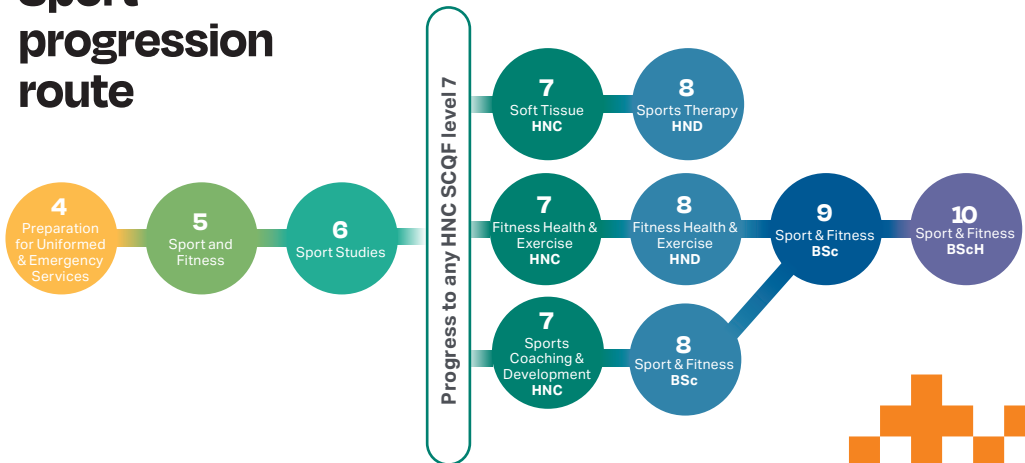

Individual progress and achievements are celebrated within a supportive, inclusive and small class environment. Experienced staff will ensure you are offered targeted support.



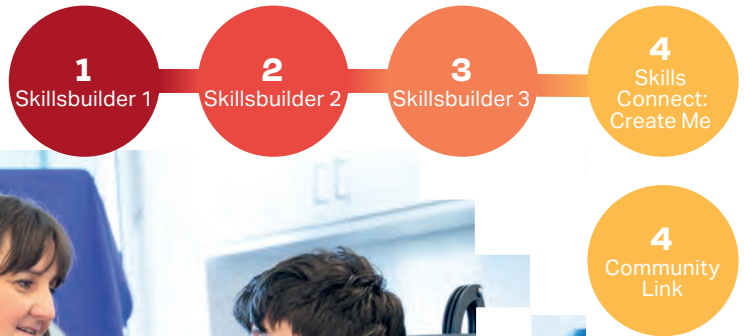

Supported Education progression route





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
